


Population: Size

- Homogeneous
- 2011: **318.452** people
- 2010:
 - -6,8% of the population had foreign citizenship
 - Polish born: 10.091 people

- Women in positions of power?




Members of the Women's list in 1987






Parliament members by gender 1874-2009








Employment rate






Positions of power 2009 and 2010








Heads of state agencies by ministries and gender


Average weekly working hours 2009











More catholic than the pope? Sterilization operations 1988-2009




A bridge between parental leave and daycare: Daycare in private homes

Elliheimilið Grund established in 1930






October 2008: 'Game Over'






Umemployment September 2008-September 2010






Flexibility of households to meet expenses 2004-2009
